


## RN Exam Applicant

## Can an RN new graduate who has not taken the NCLEX work as an RN during COVID?

- A new graduate may work as a GN with an active Temporary Disaster Permit approved from the BON until 12/14/2021.
- Failure of the NCLEX will inactivate the permit and the GN will NOT be allowed to work in the GRN role or apply for another permit.
- A GN may not use the title RN until they are fully licensed by the BON.

## What if the facility asks me to do something I feel I am not trained to do?

The facility can be more strict than the BON but may NOT be more lenient than the Board.

Refer to the Decision Making Model to assist with determination.

#### Mississippi Board of Nursing Scope of Practice Decision Making Model for APRN/RN/LPN

The Mississippi Board of Nursing recognizes that nursing practice is reflective of the dynamic changes occurring in healthcare and society. As such, it is impossible for the Mississippi Nursing Practice Law and the Mississippi Board of Nursing Administrative Code to provide a comprehensive listing of the duties that licensed nurses are permitted to perform. The licensed nurse is charged with providing nursing care in circumstances which are consistent with the nurse's education. The purpose of the decision-making model it *to provide a tool* to assist nurses, nursing students, and healthcare facilities in making sound judgment when determining whether an activity, task, procedure, role, or intervention can be safely performed. This Model should undergo periodic review by the Board's Practice Committee at minimum every three (3) years.

Is the activity, skill, procedure, role or intervention prohibited by the Mississippi NPA/Administrative Code, board rules/regulations, accreditation standards or professional scope of practice?

## Rules & Regulations for RN and LPN



## RN

Comprehensive Exams
Supervise LPN & staff
Describe & Stage Wounds
Accountable for the quality
Of nursing care given by self
or others being supervised.

#### Focused Exams

Assist the RN, not supervise Describe Wounds, CANNOT Stage May Charge in LTC if RN is available at all times but does not supervise other nurses

## What type of RN practice issues are arising during the COVID Pandemic?

- Falsification of COVID-19 Vaccination Records
- Practicing outside the scope of an RN
- Drug Diversion on the rise
- Working on expired license/without a permit
- Failure to do CPR
- Professional misconduct issues
- Social Media violations of HIPAA, racial, discrimination, rants, vulgar or offensive language, dissemination of inaccurate COVID facts by a healthcare professional.

# Failure to Initiate CPR is a Violation of the Nurse Practice Act MISS. CODE ANN.§73-15-29 (1) (c)

"Negligently or willfully acting in a manner inconsistent with the health or safety of the persons under the licensee's care."

CPR Certification is not required to perform CPR

It is NOT within the nurse's scope of practice to determine whether or not CPR should be withheld.

In the absence of a DNR order CPR must be initiated.

The DNR order should be accessible in the patients record and known to the nurses assuming care for the patient.

### **TB Skin Tests**

Does the Board of Nursing require the RN or LPN to be TB certified?

- No specific regulations or require special certification for the administration or reading of a TB skin test.
- The appropriately prepared RN or LPN may administer or read the test provided the nurse is educated and competent in the procedure.
- However, the Mississippi State Department of Health and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) require nurses to be certified in the administration and reading of TB skin tests in order for such tests and results to be considered valid.
